Student Transition Worker-Term Position

The Muskeg Lake Cree Nation's kihiw waciston School is looking for exceptional support staff to join our team for the 2025/2026 school year. The Muskeg Lake Cree Nation believes that all of our children have the right to a quality and culturally sensitive education. We believe that in order to be successful and positive contributors to the Saskatchewan community, our children must have an education that promotes scholastic and personal excellence. The school is located on the Muskeg Lake Cree Nation, which is approximately 108 km from Saskatoon.

The Student Transition Worker will facilitate and support partnership initiatives between the First Nation community schools and the affiliated provincial schools. The Student Transition Worker will ensure a smooth transition from the First Nation School to provincial school (secondary and post-secondary). The Student Transition Worker will also be required to be familiar with the post-secondary and vocational training institutions and their program offerings.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- To assist in the development and administration of transitioning programs designed to support communication between First Nation schools and the affiliated provincial schools.
- To coordinate joint professional development opportunities and place-based learning programming to facilitate positive relationships for students in both First Nation and provincial schools to ensure reasonable access for the students.
- To expand transitioning programs in order to meet the individual partnership and transition needs of students and community.
- To facilitate the cooperation of staff and community members in the delivery of place-based learning activities between First Nation and provincial schools.
- To facilitate the opportunity for families to become meaningfully engaged in their child's education.

Requirements

- > Preference will be given to an individual with a bachelor's degree in education, Social Work and/or other related fields. A combination of education and related work experience may be considered.
- Knowledge and working experience with First Nation and provincial education
- Knowledge and understanding of First Nation values, culture and Elder protocols.
- Ability to speak a First Nation language would be an asset.
- Effective interpersonal and organizational skills required.
- Reliable transportation and possess a valid driver's license; and Current Criminal Record (CPIC) and VSC must be provided.
