ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES <p>Kinistin Saulteaux Nation is seeking a highly motivated individual with strong case management skills who will successfully implement the Jordan’s Principle – Child First Initiative (JP-CFI) program. This is a new program focusing on all First Nations children living on-reserve, who have disabilities or complex needs. This program will ensure those children and their families have access to the health and social services they need, when they need them and to ensure that they do not experience denials, delays or disruptions of services due to jurisdictional disputes. Under the general direction of the KSN Director of Health, the JP Coordinator position will be responsible to plan, implement, deliver and evaluate the Jordan’s Principle program at the community level, and support the program in each of the area communities.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Help families navigate the health and social systems; and determine where and how services can be accessed.• Help with referrals for assessments to appropriate professional, or provide assessment if within scope of practice• Build case management capacity through the development of policies, procedures and protocols, related to screening and assessment, service planning, monitoring and evaluation of service plans and staff training.			

Outreach and Community Engagement

- Reach out to First Nation families and invite them to use the enhanced service coordination
- Enhance awareness in communities of existing services and supports
- Build relationships with communities and collaborate with those providing existing community-based services
- Work to proactively identify children with unmet needs to facilitate early intervention and timely access to services and resources
